Community Services	Beacon House	Organization: Beacon House provides a family home atmosphere that meets the physical, educational, emotional, and spiritual needs of orphaned and vulnerable Ghanaian children (ages 0–11). Project Opportunities: Students can base projects around their own skills, interests, and area of study. Each project is unique to the student’s abilities and created and agreed upon by both parties.
Community Services	Buduburam Refugee Camp	Organization: Established in 1990 for Liberian refugees fleeing the civil wars in their home countries. Community Training Projects (CTP) was started by a group of Liberians to address continuing developmental problems within the camp. CTP also works with two schools within the camp in order to ensure better education conditions for children. Project Opportunities: Fundraising, create lesson plans, teach English, etc., conduct research to identify community challenges and needs, assess development plans, and make suggestions for improvements.
Community Services	International Needs Ghana	Organization: Christian nonprofit improving deprived communities through development and human rights initiatives. Project Opportunities: Child protection and development, child labor and trafficking intervention, commercial sexual exploitation of children prevention, vocational skills training and rehabilitation, women's rights advocacy, and HIV/AIDS and reproductive health education. International Needs will interview the students to determine their area of interest before placement.
Community Services	Intervention Forum (IF)	Organization: NGO/Civil Service Organization (CSO) focusing on marginalized groups including people with disabilities and the poor. The organization provides educational support for students who are performing below their grade level, as well as advocate for women and children’s rights, environmental protection, community/rural development, and HIV/AIDS. Project Opportunities: Create weekly lesson plans and instructional materials (English and math), perform diagnostic testing, plan games and activities, attend city council meetings to help ensure good governance and governmental accountability, write reports on current issues.
Community Services	Madamfo Pa	Organization: Orphanage serving vulnerable and orphaned children (ages 4-18), providing clothing, food, education, cultural activities, love, support, and guidance. The program is funded through selling clothing, handbags, quilts, etc., which are handmade by staff members. Project Opportunities: Teach/tutor children (math, English, and science); iron, sew and cut fabric for quilting; fundraising; website development; create lesson plans; plan activities for children; and help enroll all children on the National Health Insurance.
Community Services	Mindfreedom Ghana	Organization: Nonprofit organization that unites 100 sponsor and affiliate grassroots groups with thousands of individual members to win human rights and alternatives for people labeled with psychiatric disabilities. Promotes education and awareness on mental health and human right issues. Project Opportunities: Research, fundraising, media, marketing and communications, social work, activism, technology, health, nonprofit management, community visits, counseling, and writing.
Community Services	Women's Assistance and Business Association (WABA)	Organization: NGO/nonprofit organization promoting legal, civic, and economic empowerment of women and girls, educating them on human rights to improve the quality of their lives. Project Opportunities: Write proposals, library work, and organize fun and educational activities for children.
Culture	Nima Muhiinmanchi Art	Organization: Collective of artists working to empower youth in Ghana to express themselves and beautify their community through art. Project Opportunities: Fundraising, social media, lead students in art projects, help with workshops.
Culture	The National Museum	Organization: Public museum located in the heart of Accra. The National Museum has three main galleries: Ghana’s past; her traditions; and with the country’s arts culture. The Museum also boasts a sculpture garden, including life-size statues of historical figures. Project Opportunities: Host tours for school children, facilitate art education, and learn curating methods.
Culture	W.E.B. DuBois Memorial Centre for Pan-African Culture	Organization: A memorial place, museum, research facility, and tourist attraction. The center promotes the realization of human rights for all people, through research, public education, the arts and constructive dialogue, as well as sponsors educational programs for high school students and research opportunities for university students. Project Opportunities: Research and development, museum management, website management, project management, and fundraising.
Development	Friends of the Earth - Ghana	Organization: Nongovernmental organization that works to conserve and make sustainable use of the world’s natural resources to improve the economic and social well-being of present and future generations and organizes campaigns to combat forest illegal actions in Ghana. Project Opportunities: Project management assistance, graphic design, documenting field visits (photography, film, writing, and drawing), creation of a film advertisement, develop brochures.

Development	Pamoja Ghana Reflect Network	<p>Organization: Nonprofit network of 28 organizations which use the Reflect approach for the implementation of literacy and other development projects (youth and adult education, particularly females; health; gender; advocacy; food security and food rights; human rights and security; governance and policy; skills security). Pamoja Ghana works for the empowerment of the poor and disadvantaged through access to education and resources.</p> <p>Project Opportunities: Fundraising, organizational development, and website development.</p>
Development	Rise Up Development Collective (RUDC)	<p>Organization: An international, volunteer-based organization, founded by a UC student, focused on improving the lives of the people of Wli Todzi, Ghana. Wli Todzi Eco-Tourism program provides the community with the tools needed to address development problems. The RUDC is currently responsible for two projects: (1) The Ghana Clinic Project and (2) The Wli Todzi Community Connection Visitors Program.</p> <p>Project Opportunities: Communication support, facilitation and documentation of projects, academic research, marketing, and outreach.</p>
Development	Trashy Bags	<p>Organization: Nonprofit that manufactures and sells bags made from reclaimed plastic drinking water and ice-cream sachets that have been collected from the streets or recycling.</p> <p>Project Opportunities: Business and website consulting, implementation of new sales outlets, online marketing and advertising, research, blogging.</p>
Education	Basics International	<p>Organization: Faith-based, charity NGO that works to alleviate illiteracy, poverty, hunger, and child labor in Ghana. Nana's House, their main facility, is a multipurpose center to teach, mentor, and sponsor children to go to school.</p> <p>Project Opportunities: Students act as mentors, tutoring children, helping them with their homework, expanding on their curriculum from their local school, and introducing them to creative learning, such as art, music, dance and sport. Also, photography/videography (film making), IT, and library work.</p>
Education	Carolyn Miller School	<p>Organization: Provides free education to 750+ refugee children, many unaccompanied and orphaned minors.</p> <p>Project Opportunities: Support teachers in the classroom, train teachers, write lesson plans and develop curriculum, counsel students, organize sporting activities, and HIV/AIDS education.</p>
Education	Catholic Action For Street Children (CAS)	<p>Organization: NGO that helps children learn a trade, go to school, and get off the streets. CAS runs a day-center or refuge where children can get advice, play games, receive medical treatment, and bathe. They also conduct field work to document the life and challenges of the youth and maintain a farm in Ashaiman as a place where the youth can receive training.</p> <p>Project Opportunities: Education/tutoring, direct rehabilitation activities, and conduct fieldwork/research.</p>
Education	Ceinode Ghana	<p>Organization: Nonprofit, private organization providing relevant and sustainable educational, economic and social development opportunities for young girls, women, youth, other minority groups, and the less privileged. Ceinode provides services such as reproductive health education, HIV/AIDS education, career training, and employment assistance.</p> <p>Project Opportunities: Create lesson plans, develop activities, teach, conduct academic/field research, analyze programs, facilitate discussions at girls club meetings, HIV/AIDS education, website development, and write grant/fundraising proposals.</p>
Education	Echoing Hills Village	<p>Organization: Faith-based organization providing recreational, residential, vocational, travel, and educational services to people with disabilities. Works in the areas of dressmaking/sewing, bread making, bead making, broom manufacturing, woodwork, crafts, and agriculture.</p> <p>Project Opportunities: After school program implementation, plan academic activities, teach, and help with developmental disabilities, speech therapy, and personal development. Background in social work helpful.</p>
Education	Exponential Education Program	<p>Organization: Nonprofit organization, founded by a UC graduate, that works with students in developing countries, helping them improve their learning levels and empowering them to become successful, socially conscious future leaders through two major programs: (1) Exponential Education Programs (EEP), a peer-to-peer after school tutoring program, and (2) Expo Tutoring Center.</p> <p>Project Opportunities: Oversee exponential education programs, provide tutoring, develop and implement new initiatives in new villages, implement workshops (educational, staff, technical, and teambuilding), conduct research, write grants, and hold fundraisers.</p>
Education	Institute for Research, Advocacy and Training (INSRAT) Youth Ambassadors for Peace & Service	<p>Organization: Non-profit educational initiative in research, advocacy, and training. INSRAT also offers services to the community and is open to all people locally and internationally, attracting researchers, non-traditional students, scholars, and traditional leaders. This program is responsible for training the youth in peace building and providing service to the community.</p> <p>Project Opportunities: Conduct research, create/establish/implement after-school programs (Youth Ambassadors for Peace & Service) for pre-K to high school aged students, tutor, create lesson plans, and recruit volunteers. Students can teach in the areas of math, science, English, French, Spanish, music, arts, reading, etc.</p>
Education	Kissemann Children's Foundation (Baskets for Education)	<p>Organization: Nonprofit organization providing academic scholarships, school supplies, and instructional lessons led by volunteers and local residents to improve their quality of life and enable them to reach their full potential.</p> <p>Project Opportunities: Create lesson plans, provide homework assistance (math, English, science, and other basic subjects), network with other NGOs, write newsletter articles, create flyers and promotional pamphlets, take photos and video, and participate in African basket weaving lessons.</p>

Education	New Horizon Special School	Organization: NGO/Nonprofit school for children and adults with mental disabilities. The New Horizon School provides education for children and vocational training and employment for adults who have intellectual disabilities. Project Opportunities: Physiotherapy, speech therapy, occupational therapy, fundraising, facilitation of activities and support groups, lesson plan development and teaching (art/music therapy, etc.), assessment of the needs and strengths of students, and drafting individual educational plans.
Education	Opportunities Industrial Centre-Accra (OIC)	Organization: Technical/Vocational nonprofit organization offering care and economic support to people living with HIV/AIDS. Provides orphans and other vulnerable children the opportunity to attend OIC's skills training program. Project Opportunities: Teaching (entrepreneurship, English, math), fundraising, and conducting psycho-social counseling.
Education	Start-Rite School	Organization: An early childhood development and primary educational institution in Ghana. Project Opportunities: Teach ESL for the primary department and assist with preschool children.
Education	Students Bridging the Information Gap, Inc. (SBIG)	Organization: US-based NGO that provides orphanages in impoverished African countries with computers for learning labs and age appropriate reading materials for libraries. Project Opportunities: Observe/analyze how current SBIG facilities are being utilized, review peace corps applications, travel to past projects and make recommendations for improvements.
Education	University of Ghana Basic School	Organization: Educational institution aspiring to achieve and maintain high academic and moral standards among kindergarten to junior high students. Project Opportunities: Assist teachers in the classroom, teach in area of specialty, create syllabi, prepare lesson notes, etc. Subjects offered include music, math, English, science, social studies, and extracurricular activities.
Education	University of Ghana, Department of Crop Sciences	Organization: Works on strategies for the sustainable production/sale of vegetables and trains peri-urban vegetable producers on the effective use of pesticides to ensure food security in Ghana and West Africa. Project Opportunities: Understudy farm assistants/lab technicians in the use of effective crop production methods.
Health	Ghana-West Africa Program to Combat AIDS and STIs (WAPCAS)	Organization: WAPCAS aims to control and reduce new HIV/AIDS/STI infections among key populations (KP) as well as the transmission of the infections to the general population through the provision of preventive and curative services using peer-to-peer education.
Health	Health Access Network (HAN)	Organization: Promotes access health through three major areas: drug supply to mission hospitals, training of health care providers, and research/advocacy on access to medicines related issues. Project Opportunities: Development and improvement of the website, communication through e-newsletters, and fundraising.
Health	Hope for Future Generations	Organization: Gender-based organization that focuses on preventive health services, HIV prevention and support, poverty reduction, and behavior change communication programs. Their mission is to form partnerships to improve the health, education and socio-economic status of women and children through empowerment, rights based approaches, and innovative and acceptable participatory strategies. Project Opportunities: HIV prevention projects, fundraising, behavior change support projects, and marketing.
Health	La General Hospital	Organization: Provides 24-hour OPD, In-Patient and Emergency Services, and focuses on General Medicine, General Surgery, Pediatrics, Obstetric/Gynecological Care, Maternal Health, and Family Planning. Project Opportunities: Students can assist in any number of their programs.
Health	La Mansaamo Kpee (LMK)	Organization: Offers health care to the community and basic training and vocational skills. Project Opportunities: Fundraising, education, and skill training.
Health	Osu Gov't Maternity Home	Organization: Ante/postnatal clinic focusing on delivery services, family planning, child welfare, and dispensary and laboratory services. Project Opportunities: Students can assist in any number of their programs.
Health	Pro-Link Ghana	Organization: Development-oriented, nonprofit organization that empowers disadvantaged people, especially women and girls, to improve their human rights, health, education and socio-economic status. Current projects include: health (maternal health/child survival/Nutrition/HIV/STI/TB), economic empowerment for women, social accountability and engagement, anti-child trafficking and gender-based violence programs. Project Opportunities: Community mobilization, peer education, data collection, and field work.
Health	Save the Nation's Sight	Organization: Optometry clinic aimed at reducing the rates of preventable blindness through surgeries, refractions, cataract removals, and eye treatments. Offers free care to those with the national health insurance and provides low cost care to those without. Project Opportunities: Measure patients' vision, observe operations, post-surgical care (patch eye, give medicines and instructions), fundraising, web site development, and outreach (trips to villages to measure vision and dispense reading glasses).

Health	West Africa Aids Foundation/ International Health Center	Organization: Works to fight the spread of HIV/AIDS, TB, and other communicable and non communicable diseases and mitigate their effects on communities by providing care and support and developing and implementing pragmatic intervention programs. Project Opportunities: Develop projects and program plans to improve service, shadow doctors/nurses, plan events, fundraise, and provide community health screenings. Students can act as health educators, facilitating community health education programs and counseling on various health topics including cholera, HIV (preventing mother to child transmission; stigmatization), reproductive health, and LGBT.
Law/Politics	African Union Diaspora African Forum	Organization: NGO that provides a bridge by which the African diaspora can participate in Africa's social and economic redevelopment. It conducts programs and projects to strengthen relations between Diaspora and continental Africans to alleviate poverty and improve the lives of Africans. Project Opportunities: Research, administration, create structured internship program.
Law/Politics	LAWA (Ghana) Alumnae Incorporated	Organization: Nonprofit promoting public policy on the human rights of women in Ghana and Africa. LAWA Alumnae focuses on legislative consultation, parliamentary lobbying, sensitization and training programs on laws and policies, legal literacy programs, research based advocacy, including fact finding mission on human rights issues, and paralegal training programs. Project Opportunities: Research and prepare/write reports and articles for publication in the dailies as well as visit projects sites in the Central and Volta Regions and report on observations.
Law/Politics	The Justice Foundation	Organization: Apolitical, nonprofit, non-religious organization with the purpose of increasing access to justice in Ghana. The organization promotes a respect for human rights, ensures an effective justice delivery system, and provides free legal aid to low-income defendants. Project Opportunities: Conduct legal research, draft letters and memoranda, respond to inquiries from the general public, review newspapers and news websites for human rights/legal stories, and coordinate programs.
Nongovernmental Organization (NGO)	Fair River International Association Development (FARIAD)	Organization: NGO that aims to eradicate poverty and contribute to the preservation of natural resources through environmental conservation, agriculture, health and entrepreneurial development. Project Opportunities: Fundraising, online crowdfunding, grant writing, and creating training workshops (sustainable farming, etc.).
Nongovernmental Organization (NGO)	Ghana Clean Advocacy	Organization: NGO created to "change lives through advocacy" on natural and environmental resources, and health and sanitation. Project Opportunities: Data collection, administer surveys regarding water access, organize educational programs to promote proper waste disposal and sanitation.
