Shanghai, China (Fudan University) - International Studies

APPOINTMENT and RESIDENCY PERIOD

- Late August through late December, 2010
UC instructors need to be on site at least a week prior to the start of the semester.

HOST UNIVERSITY AND CAPACITY

- Fudan University – Up to 70 UC students, plus up to 30 Fudan University Students

JOB AND PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Ladder-rank UC faculty in the social sciences or humanities are invited to apply for a teaching position in the *UC-Fudan University Joint Program in International Studies (JPIS)* for fall or spring semester, 2010-11.

The JPIS is a series of English-language semester courses that concentrate on the study of the processes, manifestations, and debates of globalization. UC and Fudan University students take courses together, pursue joint research projects, and engage in critical thinking about globalization and its related impact on social, cultural, environmental, political, and economic issues.

The curriculum consists of upper-division, interdisciplinary and comparative courses primarily in the social sciences and humanities which concentrate on globalization and the associated debates, global relations, economics, and culture of China. Courses are taught in English by Fudan University and UC faculty. Courses have tutorial or discussion sessions staffed by Teaching Assistants from Fudan University.

TEACHING

UC faculty instructor will be required to co-teach one or two sections of the primary required course that constitutes the core course of the program curriculum. The core course is projected to have a total enrollment of 80-100 students and, depending on student applications and interest, two sections of up to 40-50 students each may be required. Faculty will have some latitude in determining the structure, content, and activities of the individual course listed below.

Debating Globalization:

This core course is required for all UC students and will be co-taught with a Fudan University faculty member. The course deals with the process of, and debates concerning, globalization, China's responses and contributions to globalization, the impacts of globalization on Chinese society, culture and economy, and the unique history and role of Shanghai in China, the Pacific region and the world. This course should capitalize on the Shanghai setting to encourage out-of-classroom exploration of Shanghai related to associated processes, changes, and developments. Course should be appropriate for accomplished, advanced undergraduates with no prior training in the discipline.

LANGUAGE SKILLS

- Visiting Faculty – Chinese language ability desirable, but not required.
- Students – There is no language prerequisite for students; instruction is provided in English.

FACULTY DISCIPLINES PREFERRED FOR THIS POSITION

- Social Sciences (Global Studies, International Studies, Political Science, etc.) or Humanities (Cultural Studies, Literature, Media Studies, etc.), but all fields related to contemporary China will be considered.

OFFICE LOCATION

JPIS is offered at the Handan campus of Fudan University in the Yangpu District of northeast Shanghai. The EAP Study Center is located on the Fudan University campus.

OFFICE STAFF

A UC Study Center Director and staff assist UC students and UC instructors with many details of the program.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS

This position is a ***Short-Term Teaching Assignment*** rather than a Study Center Directorship.

COMPENSATION

UC faculty instructors in this program remain on their campus home department's payroll for the duration of appointment term in China. Participant's department will receive course release funds in the amount of \$11,000 to compensate department for the participation of its faculty member in this program.

In addition, UOEAP agrees to provide the UC faculty instructor abroad with the following financial reimbursements as proscribed within UC Policy and Regulations Governing Travel Reimbursements:

- A. One lowest economy round-trip airfare from California to Shanghai, China
- B. Reimbursement of lodging expenses for the period concurrent with your term of appointment, not to exceed \$4,000.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

The deadline for receipt of completed applications, supporting documentation and signed campus endorsements is 5:00 p.m. on Friday, October 16, 2009 (*late applications will not be accepted*).

HOW TO APPLY

STEP 1 Prepare and Submit Application Form and Supporting Documentation, to include the following items:

- UOEAP Abbreviated Application Form**
- A brief statement of interest discussing your reasons for applying, to include:**
 - a) Succinct teaching proposal/course syllabus for the course(s) you would like to teach, as well as your credentials for teaching in the program.
 - b) Documentation of strong teaching skills (teaching awards, summaries of teaching evaluations and/or letters)
- Curriculum vitae, please limit Publications and Presentations section to *no more than five pages in length*.**

STEP 2 Obtain Campus Endorsement Approvals for Potential Release from Campus:

- Acquisition of signature approvals for proposed release time from campus is required from applicant's Department Chair and Dean. **Completed Campus Endorsements may initially be submitted by email, with signed originals sent as specified below:**
 - a) **Present the Campus Endorsement Form to your Department Chair for signature approval and request that they forward to your Dean for approval.** For their review and consideration, it is recommended you include a cover letter detailing your request, along with photocopies of your completed Application Form and the Job Description & Program Details Profile Summary for each position you are applying for.
 - b) **Monitor the signature approval process on your campus to ensure that** your campus are completed and received by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, October 16, 2009 to:
